

Chapelle Acorn/Summer Camp

Reopening Guidance for K-12 Summer Activities from the Louisiana Department of Education in consultation with the State of Louisiana Office of Public Health

The State of Louisiana has been focused on following the guidance of experts in public health when making decisions about the reopening of facilities and resumption of activities statewide. Louisiana's plan for reopening outlines a set of phases that are initiated once certain public health criteria are met. Throughout these phases, restrictions will be gradually relaxed, allowing greater flexibility, including as it relates to the operation of summer programming in schools.

In Phases 1, 2, and 3, summer activities on K-12 campuses may occur with certain restrictions in place. The Louisiana Department of Education (LDOE), in consultation with the State of Louisiana Office of Public Health, offers the supporting guidance in order to assist K-12 schools in adhering to public health guidelines and ensuring the health and safety of their children and staff. Please note the specific measures Archbishop Chapelle High School has taken to prevent the spread of Covid-19, listed below each bullet provided by LDOE.

NOTE: Guidance may change in accordance with updates from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and Louisiana's Office of Public Health.

Group Size and Physical Standards

- 1. Implement social distancing strategies
 - a. Phase 1: June 1-5 | We will maintain static groups of 10 people, including adults, for the maximum duration of camp.
 - b. Phase 2: June 8-12, June 15-19, June 22-26 | We will maintain static groups of 25 people, including adults, for the maximum duration of camp.
 - c. For Phases 1 and 2, groups will be indoors in an assigned meeting space, enclosed by walls or partitions.
 - i. Groups will eat snack/lunch in their assigned meeting spaces.

- ii. Groups will not convene in shared indoor spaces unless they are cleaned before and after each group's use.
- iii. Groups will not participate in contact sports.

2. Change parent drop-off and pick-up processes to limit contact

- a. Each camper will be assigned 1 of 3 designated drop-off locations based off of their camp schedule.
 - i. Campers will be screened for illness upon arrival by Tulane Medical staff with assistance from Archbishop Chapelle High School staff.
 - ii. A parent may stay in their car during screening, but cannot leave campus until their child has been admitted to camp.
 - 1. If campers are carpooling and one or more campers in a single vehicle does not pass her screening, no campers from the vehicle will be admitted to camp.
 - iii. Before care and after care are cancelled.
 - iv. Children will be admitted to camp no earlier than 8:15AM (15 minutes prior to the beginning of camp.)
 - v. Upon completing their screening at arrival, campers will be immediately walked to a hand washing station to by Chapelle Ambassadors.
- b. Each camper will be assigned 1 of 3 designated pick-up locations based off of their camp schedule.
- c. Hand hygiene stations will be placed at all entrances of facilities on campus, including drop-off locations.

3. Ensure extracurricular and athletic activities follow established safety and hygiene protocols

- a. In Phase 1 and 2, groups will not participate in contact sports. Survivor, Ninja Warrior, and Sports camps will engage in activities that allow the girls to be socially distant.
- b. Sporting equipment will be cleaned and disinfected following each use.

Symptom Monitoring

4. Require sick students and staff to stay home

- a. Individuals who have a fever of 100.4°F or above, or other signs of illness, will not be admitted to the facility
 - If campers are carpooling and one or more campers in a single vehicle does not pass her screening, no campers from the vehicle will be admitted to camp.
- b. We have stressed the importance to the staff of being vigilant for symptoms and staying in touch with school leadership if or when they start to feel sick.
- c. Children and staff who come to campus sick or who become sick while on campus will be immediately placed in a designated isolation area and sent

home as soon as possible.

5. Screen students for sickness upon arrival

- a. Individuals who have a fever of 100.4°F or above or other signs of illness will not be admitted to the facility. Participants will be screened for fever upon arrival as well as throughout the day.
 - i. At drop-off, each child's parent/guardian will confirm that the student has not taken fever-reducing medication in the last 24 hours and does not have shortness of breath, sore throat, or a cough.
- **b.** Staff members will make visual inspections of the child for signs of illness, which could include flushed cheeks, rapid breathing or difficulty breathing, fatigue, or, in young children, extreme or unusual fussiness.

6. Implement isolation measures if a student becomes sick and follow with a cleaning and disinfecting processes.

- a. Children and staff who come to campus sick or who become sick while on campus will be immediately placed in a designated isolation area and sent home as soon as possible.
- b. In addition to hourly disinfecting, campus spaces will be vigorously cleaned and disinfected nightly.
- c. CDC guidelines will be followed on how to disinfect campus buildings if someone is sick or is diagnosed with Covid-19.

7. Address vulnerable individuals

- a. Federal guidance indicates that elderly individuals and those with serious underlying health conditions, including high blood pressure, chronic lung disease, diabetes, obesity, asthma, and those whose immune systems are compromised such as by chemotherapy for cancer, might be at higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19.
 - i. Parents of children with known health conditions are urged to discuss participation in summer camp with the child's physician.

Environmental Cleaning and Personal Hygiene

8. Ensure healthy personal hygiene

- a. All camp staff, including Chapelle Ambassadors, will wear facemasks during the entirety of camp. While campers are not required to wear facemasks, we highly encourage the use of protective facemasks by all attendees of Chapelle Summer Camp.
 - i. If a camper chooses to wear a protective facemask, the mask must stay on the child for the entirety of camp, except for snack and lunchtime. The camper must have a bag clearly labeled with their name to hold the mask during snack and lunchtime.
- b. All children and staff must engage in hand hygiene at least every two hours and at the following times:

- i. Arrival and exit of the facility and after breaks
- ii. Before and after using outdoor play equipment
- iii. Before and after preparing, eating, or handling food or drinks, or feeding children
- iv. Before and after administering medication or medical ointment
- v. After using the bathroom or helping a child use the bathroom
- vi. After coming in contact with bodily fluid
- vii. After handling animals
- viii. After playing outdoors
- ix. After handling garbage
- c. Hands must be washed with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If hands are not visibly dirty, alcohol-based hand sanitizers with at least 60 percent alcohol will be used if soap and water are not readily available.

9. Intensify cleaning and disinfecting efforts

- a. Staff will disinfect high-touch surfaces, such as door handles, light switches, faucets, toys and games that children play with on an hourly basis.
- b. In addition to hourly disinfecting, campus spaces will be vigorously cleaned and disinfected nightly.
- c. Toys/supplies will not be shared among static groups unless they are cleaned and sanitized before and after each group's use.

Additional Operating Considerations

10. Ensure healthy food preparation and meal service

- a. Meals will be served in assigned static group classrooms, rather than the cafeteria.
- b. No prepared food will be provided during lunch, including pizza. Individually packaged snacks will be available for purchase during break and lunch.
- **c.** Camp staff will ensure that campers wash hands prior to and immediately after eating.

11. Ensure transportation staff are following safety and hygiene protocols.

a. Chapelle Summer Camp does not offer off-campus activities for our campers.
All transportation to and from camp is provided by the camper's legal parent/guardian.
